

**TOWN OF PARIS  
SPECIAL MEETING  
JANUARY 25, 2005**

The January 25, 2005, special meeting of the Paris Town Board was called to order at 6:35 p.m. by Chairman Virgil Gentz with all members in attendance.

Two bids were received for the Memorial Garden Project by the deadline on January 24, 2005. The first one opened was from Biehn Construction, 12721 – 12<sup>th</sup> Street, Kenosha, for an amount of \$121,566.00. The second one opened was from Kenosha Grounds Care, 8330 – 88<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Pleasant Prairie, for an amount of \$83,816.25.

Atty. Quinn looked through the bids and both of them looked complete with all attachments. The company approved would need a performance bond and a pre-construction meeting would need to be scheduled.

Ken asked if there was a prevailing wage packet attached to the Kenosha Grounds Care bid. Atty. Quinn suggested modifying the bid to attach a prevailing wage statement if needed. Ken would like to see it added.

Mike Christensen commented on his concern of the prices being quite high and if the board wanted his committee to go back to the drawing board to get the prices down, he would understand.

The board agreed that the plan is good, the committee already put in many hours, Kenosha Grounds Care will do a good job and we should just move ahead.

Monson made a motion to award the bid to Kenosha Grounds Care for an amount of \$83,816.25 with the condition he agrees to pay prevailing wage to his workers and subcontractors. Ashmus made the second. Motion passed on a roll call vote with all yes votes.

On an Ashmus/Monson motion and second, meeting was adjourned at 6:55 p.m.
